Forest Gate student has memory of note

Award winning student surprises St Bonaventure classmates

How many elements of the Periodic Table can you recall? Ashley Singh, 16, a student of St Bonaventure's School in Forest Gate, has memorised all 92.

In preparation for their GCSE exams, Ashley, along with the rest of his classmates, was encouraged by his science teacher, Brian Brennan, to learn the first 20 elements of the periodic table. Instead, Ashley learned the entire thing and recited it in class.

Creating a story around each piece of information helped him to keep it all in order. He learned about the technique from reading a manual.

The Periodic Table arranges chemical elements on the basis of their atomic number, electron configurations and recurring chemical properties.

On top of his GCSE preparation, Ashley is also Head Boy, a member of the School Council and established an anti-bullying campaign at St Bonaventure's.

A singer songwriter who taught himself to play guitar, Ashley is a familiar face not only at school concerts but also in the West End. He was recently chosen to play at Piccadilly Theatre by the Jack Petchey Foundation.

Ashley is a winner of the Foundation's Achievement Award for his extra-curricular and charity work. The Award comes with £200 prize money to be spent on the school. Ashley wants to use this on providing St Bonaventure's Guitar Ensemble with re-conditioned instruments.

As well as passing his GCSEs, Ashley's future plan is pursuing a career in music, which he has said is his first love.

Possible Changes to the LA's School Financial Consultancy Service – SFCS (Bursar Service)

The LA has asked NPW to consider the possibility of taking on their SFCS during 2015/16

If the transfer was agreed, the development of a professional financial consultancy service within NPW would complement the range of support services currently being provided, namely Schools HR; Governor Support; Education ICT; School Management Support and School Improvement.

At the same time as being approached by the LA, NPW have also received expressions of interest from some schools at the termly-held User Group meetings, asking if NPW would investigate options for setting up its own Financial Support / Bursar service. Therefore, NPW have agreed to consider the options and are in discussions with the LA.

Although rollout of this project is subject to approval by both the NPW Board and the LA Executive, work has commenced to undertake a detailed due diligence exercise to help inform the decision about if / how to proceed.

A key part of this work is consultation with all schools, which also asks for feedback about possible future procurement advice that schools may be interested in. The consultation is relevant to all schools, even those buying financial consultancy / bursar services from a 3rd party company or through their own directly employed finance staff. This is because there would potentially be additional services available for schools to supplement their current arrangements.
