

Tollgate wins National Autistic Society Award

Recognised for Inspirational Education Provision

Tollgate Primary School has been recognised by the National Autistic Society, winning the award for Inspirational Education Provision.

"They had a vision and the determination to continue to push boundaries." Says the judgement, which went on to say: "Its fully inclusive philosophy is unlike many other provisions for children with similar needs".

Liz Harris, Deputy Headteacher at Tollgate, said: "The Awards seek to acknowledge the outstanding contributions and achievements of individuals, teams and organisations who have demonstrated excellence, dedication and commitment to improving the lives of people with autism. We would like to thank all of our families for working alongside us to make our team so exceptional".

The school won in the primary school category and was selected for its unique approach to teaching children with autism, receiving particular praise for its pioneering use of iPads to enhance learning. The judgement pointed to "A number of standout features such as the whole school approach, the range of environmental options, the autism curriculum, the family support and the knowledge sharing with other organisations" which made

the school "outstanding" and "exceptional".

Tollgate was one of 13 winners from all across the country who were recognised for their various services in supporting people with autism at the 2015 Autism Professional Awards. The Awards Ceremony took place on Tuesday 3rd March at the Royal Hall, Harrogate.

The awards were created to recognise and reward services and professionals who are leading the way in innovative autism practice and making a real difference to the lives of people with autism in the UK.

Our students distinguished themselves with the depth of their questions and we are extremely grateful to the Ambassador for his clear and direct answers.


