

## From Rokeby to Russia

*Rokeby pupils are first to visit the Russian Embassy*

**On 26th March, a group of Year 10 Russian language students from Rokeby School had the privilege of being the first school in the UK to visit the Russian Embassy.**

"I have never seen anything like it before. Old fashioned building, furniture, amazingly comfortable chairs in the Golden Room, even a chance to hold the torch of the Sochi Winter Olympic Games 2014, how cool is that?" said Rokeby student Raimondas Stramaitis.

"The fact that we were the first school group ever to visit the embassy made the day even more special" said Ms Deimante Dambrauskiene, the Russian teacher.

The group were met by Attaché Ms Elizaveta Vokorina and Councillor Mr Sergey Nalobin, Russian diplomats who took the students on a tour of the Embassy and talked about the purpose and role of diplomatic missions, what it takes to become a diplomat and why diplomacy is so important in the modern world.

Over the course of their visit the students learned how language proficiency could widen their career choices in future.

The visit was organised with support of East London Business Alliance, a community investment



charity, and Pinsent Masons law firm.

The students were given an hour-long tour of the residence before meeting the Russian Ambassador for a question and answer session about his mission and daily life as Russia's Ambassador to the UK.

Rokeby called the visit a huge success which gave the students the opportunity to use their Russian language and feel proud of it.

Students Rihards Boriss, Dionisio Ribad Miguel and Peter Adesola said that: "We enjoyed meeting the Ambassador Mr. Alexander Yakovenko the most, as he answered the questions we had prepared, and we even got to shake his hand. We left the Embassy enriched by facts about Russia's culture, politicians, artists,

musicians and fascinating history".

Meanwhile, Erik Michailov and Rejus Jarusevicius said: "We like nature very much, so the Winter Garden made the best impression on us".

On the way to the Embassy, the students revised the questions they had prepared for the ambassador, and taught some basic Russian to Ms Sarah Lawson, the English-speaking teacher accompanying them, as well as fellow train-users who took the opportunity to learn from the Rokeby group.

"I was pleasantly surprised that we were the very first students to visit the Russian Embassy" said Ignas Serepka. And Liutauras Stankevicius summarised: "Can you believe that they rent this residence for £1 per year?"
