

New Environmental Health training

On Monday, 24 October 2016, NPW piloted new environmental health training.

Led by NPW Client Catering Development Officer, Grainne Sheehy, attendees studied towards attaining the Chartered Institute for Environmental Health (CIEH) Level 2 Award in Food Safety.

The training covered concepts of food hygiene, food hazards and how they can be controlled. There was a final assessment where candidates were examined.

There were six attendees at the pilot training session, all of whom successfully passed to gain the Level 2 Award.



This course is aimed at teachers, resource, and extra provision providers and other school staff using food in the curriculum or otherwise.

Everyone who works with food has a special safeguarding responsibility to ensure the food they prepare or serve is safe to eat.

New First Aid at Work with Paediatric Training

NPW has received a number of requests to provide schools with a jointly certified First Aid at Work and Paediatric First Aid training qualification. This course does not currently exist and was unavailable...until now.

NPW and Strong Roots Training have developed a bespoke training programme for schools/educational establishments.

First Aid at Work with Paediatrics

This course is designed to give the 'First Aider' the skills and knowledge to manage First Aid incidents in the workplace setting. It includes the required time allocation for the Paediatric Course, satisfying Ofsted requirements. The course is run as one event but will be awarded as two qualifications with two certificates issued, Level 3 First Aid at Work and Level 3 Paediatric First Aid.

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St Bonaventure's scoop the news from the red carpet

Year 9 St Bonaventure's student, Kelvin Paul, got the scoop from the premiere of the latest Marvel epic, Doctor Strange.

During half term, Kelvin went to Westminster Abbey to interview stars Benedict Cumberbatch, Rachel McAdams and Tilda Swinton as well as other members of the cast and crew and crew on the red carpet.

Kelvin asked the actors detailed questions based on the film, including: just as Dr Strange does in the film, how did they leave their comfort zones?

Benedict Cumberbatch said: "People ask me what I have in common with my character and I

feel that's really it. I was having to do action hero stuff on a level I've never done before and wire-work and kung-fu moves and casting these spells with these amazing movements involving tutting with the fingers and these very delicate hand movements as well as the rest of the body posturing and I was learning that as much as my character was."

He also asked what celebrated neuro-surgeon Dr Strange would find if he explored their brains?



"There's lots of things I've lost in there so I'd like to get them back. So maybe he could help me with all my memories that I've lost," said Rachel McAdams, who plays Dr Christine Palmer in the film.

Kelvin said: "I had

so much fun and all the actors were really lovely with me and put me at ease which really helped settle my nerves. They didn't seem to mind I was only 13, they were really professional and answered all my questions and didn't patronise me which was wonderful. The film was great too. I'd definitely recommend it."

Kelvin managed the exclusive chats with the stars as part of his involvement with the BFI's Into Film. The education scheme delivers a wide range of activities to encourage watching, making and critical understanding of film for 5-19 year olds across the UK.

Kelvin won the October Jack Petchey Award for his participation in school life and as an ambassador for the school, exemplified by his performance at the *Doctor Strange* premier.

Head teacher Paul Halliwell said: "What a magnificent opportunity for a 13 year old. Most teens would have been star struck and extremely nervous to meet famous actors but it was testament to Kelvin that he remained professional throughout and was as cool as a cucumber. He deserves this award for representing our school so wonderfully."

Newham beat national results in Religious Education

The national average for A*-C GCSE results in Religious Studies was just under 71%. In Newham 78% of students attained A*-C in the subject, a full 7% higher.

Claire Clinton, Newham's Religious

Education Advisor said: "We are so proud of our students who worked hard to gain these incredible results, and of course the many fantastic RE teachers who supported them. To be well above the national average in a subject is something for Newham to

celebrate."

The national average for A*-A grade was 27%, which Newham also beat, gaining 29%. That means nearly one third of the 2,100 Newham students who took the exam got this top grade.

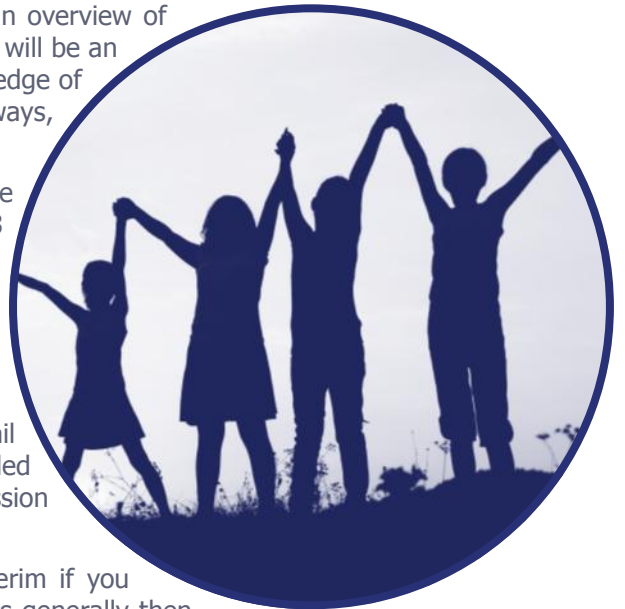

Successful Early Years Ofsted Inspections

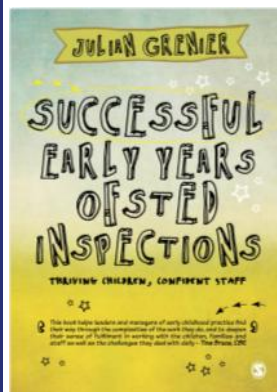


The stakes have never been higher: Ofsted have a new, tougher inspection framework for the early years. If your early years are judged to be less than good, that will affect your overall school grading too.
